Core Classes

Every 8th grader takes 4 core classes:

- >English
- >Math
- >Science
- >History

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>Some students will be assigned an extra Reading or Math support class.

>These will be determined for you based on STAAR scores.

8th Grade Course Request options student may select.

- > YOU WILL CHOOSE YOUR TOP 3 CHOICES AND 2 ALTERNATES FOR A TOTAL OF 5.
- > RANK THEM IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE.
- > WE WILL DO OUR BEST TO GIVE YOU YOUR TOP 3 CHOICES, BUT SOMETIMES CONFLICTS ARISE THAT FORCE YOU TO BE SCHEDULED IN ONE OF YOUR ALTERNATE CHOICES.
- > CHOOSE ELECTIVES THAT ARE RIGHT FOR YOU, NOT YOUR FRIEND.



Physical Activity Choose 1

You have one of 3 choices for a physical activity:

- 1. Athletics
- 2. PE
- 3. Girls Gymnastics PE (OR CO-ED TEAM REQUIRES TRY OUT)
- > State law REQUIRES a physical for ALL students in athletics.
- > Boys MUST play football.
- > Boy sports include: football, basketball, cross-country and track.
- > Girls sports include: volleyball, basketball, cross-country, track and soccer.
- > Students not playing football but interested in other sports will need to try out when that sport starts. You will need to select PE until you make the team.
- > Uniform fees do apply to both boys and girls athletics.
- > No jewelry allowed in athletics.



Band (returning students only)

This is an introductory course in band. Students will learn the fundamentals of music and basic playing skills. No previous music training is required. Students will need to practice individually outside of school hours and attend a few outside rehearsals and performances. The band director will approve instruments and students will rent them through the school or a music dealer.



^{*} All students will select 3 electives and 2 alternates. All elective choices are REQEUST and NOT guaranteed. However, we will do our best to make your choices work with the rest of your schedule.

Choir

Students will learn music fundamentals and basic singing skills. The teacher, according to voice type and level of development, makes assignment to appropriate classes. Students will need to practice individually outside of school hours and attend a few outside rehearsals and performances. Some expense for a choir uniform may be required.



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<u>Art</u>

This is a broad course utilizing art fundamentals in areas of two-dimensional and three-dimensional design. Areas covered may include design, drawing, painting, printmaking, ceramics, and sculpture.



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Business Information Management (must not had taken in 8th grade)




This course orients students with word processing, database, spreadsheet, and multi-media presentation applications. Students implement personal and interpersonal skills to strengthen individual performance in the workplace, in society, and to make a successful transition to the workforce and/or postsecondary education. Students apply technical skills to address business applications for emerging technologies. This course meets the technology requirement for high school graduation.

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Principles of Applied Engineering (must not had taken in 8th grade)



This course gives an overview of technology with application of knowledge from many fields like biotechnology, communication, computer applications, construction, energy, power, transportation, and manufacturing. Students discover the link between engineering and technology while utilizing varied computer programs and many hands-on design, team, and technology projects. Students build scale models and prototypes as well as learn emerging technologies, technology history, workplace safety, career possibilities, and college and career information. A primary goal is the application of science, technology, engineering, and math to everyday life. This course meets the technology requirement for high school graduation.

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
Cybersecurity

This course is about exploring how to respond to computer security breaches and virus and administering network security measures.

This laboratory course enables students to investigate careers in the human services career cluster, including counseling and mental health, early childhood development, family and community, and personal care services. Successful completion of two semesters fulfills the health graduation requirement.


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
Spanish IB (1 year students/non native speakers, Meaning your currently with Ms. Keith.)
