#### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS IN HEB ISD

#### **26 TOTAL CREDITS REQUIRED**

- 4 credits of English (English 1, 2, 3, 4)
- 4 credits of Math (Algebra 1 + 3 additional math courses must include Algebra 2 for DLA)
- 4 credits of Science (Biology + 3 sciences- must include Chemistry or Physics)
- 4 credits of Social Studies (World Geography, World History, US History, US Government,
   Economics)
- 2 credits World Languages (same language)
- 1 credit Visual/Performing Arts (Art, Dance, Music, or Theatre)
- 1 credit Physical Education
- 1 credit Technology
- .5 credit Health or equivalent
- .5 credit Professional Communications or equivalent
- · 4 credits of electives leading toward an endorsement

#### 5 endorsement options

All students must earn at least one endorsement Students may earn multiple endorsements

- arts and humanities
- business and industry
- multidisciplinary studies
  - public service
    - stem





#### earn credit before 9th grade

Students in junior high may be able to start earning high school credit BEFORE 9<sup>th</sup> grade! Some courses require program entry in 7<sup>th</sup> grade through Schools of Choice, or require a pre-requisite, and not all courses are offered on each campus, or at all grade levels. Please check with your campus for available offerings.

Remember that if you are taking a class for high school credit, the grade you make WILL COUNT toward your Grade Point Average (GPA) and class rank, even though you are only in 7 <sup>th</sup> grade!  Practice setting and reaching SMART (Specific, Measurable, Aligned, Results-based, Time-bound) goals.  Start saving money for college.  Challenge and stretch yourself by participating in school clubs/activities or volunteering.  Find adults and friends who will lift you up and encourage you to be your best.  Build yourself a support team of parents, guardians, relatives or other trusted adults who will help you on your path to your future.	<ul> <li>□ Take the Xello Matchmaker to help you determine your strongest areas of interest for future careers.</li> <li>□ Visit the Buinger Career and Technical Education Academy to learn about college and career options.</li> <li>□ Select the endorsement and program of study that best fits your area of personal interest for future college and career readiness.</li> <li>□ Take the PSAT 8/9 – this Practice SAT will help you identify areas of academic strength, and help you work on where you are weaker, academically.</li> <li>□ Recognize most college entrance requirements include rigorous academic choices, including Algebra II, higher-level science courses, and world languages.</li> <li>□ Recognize many career choices will require additional licensing/certifications.</li> <li>□ Remember, any course you are taking for high school credit WILL COUNT toward your GPA and class rank.</li> </ul>
